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TEACHING SAFE PRACTICE

Aims of the Course

The BOFAS Education Committee has run The Principles course since 2011 across the UK. The aim is to give Trainee Orthopaedic Surgeons a solid grounding in the principles and the decision making in Foot & Ankle Surgery. The course has expanded to India with IOFAS (Indian Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Society) and to Africa in partnership with COSECSA (College of Surgeons of Eastern, Central & Southern Africa) and last year we have done the first course in the Middle East in partnership with MEFAS (Middle East Foot and Ankle Surgery).

There is an emphasis on clinical examination of cases, small group discussions and learning surgical approaches in the cadaver lab. The course is entirely sponsored by the British Society members, and we now train 72 trainees in the UK and 40 in both India & Africa per year.

This is the second course we are running in UAE and the aim is to expand the Foot and Ankle education and training in the Middle East and Gulf area.

Faculty

The faculty have been selected for either their extensive surgical experience in the UAE or as expert teachers of Foot & Ankle Surgery in the United Kingdom. Thus, there is a very international faculty from across the world.

The BOFAS Principles course prides itself on the low number of trainees per faculty teacher.

Feedback

Responding to feedback is a key principle of the course and both the format and content are adjusted to meet the requirements of the trainees.

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COURSE DIRECTOR

Dr. Anna Chapman (Course Director)



Mrs Anna Chapman is a consultant trauma and orthopaedics surgeon at University Hospitals, Coventry and Warwickshire, with a specialist in Foot and Ankle Surgery. She qualified from Guy's and Kings and St Thomas's Hospital school of Medicine in London and completed her Orthopaedics training in the Warwick rotation. She undertook Fellowship training in Bournemouth and Bristol and was appointed as a consultant in 2012. She completed a Master's degree in Medical Education at the University of Warwick in 2010 and continued to pursue in all things educational. Anna is currently the Training Programme Director for the Warwick Orthopaedics Speciality Training Programme, served two terms on the BOFAS Education Committee and is Chair of the BOFAS EdI working group.

Dr. Ehab Kheir (Course Director)



Dr Ehab Kheir is an established Orthopaedic Surgeon trained in the UK. He is a consultant orthopaedic surgeon specialising in foot and ankle surgery practicing in Mediclinic Parkview Hospital in Dubai. He has vast experience of treating complex foot and ankle conditions. During his training, he gained a breadth of knowledge in different subspecialties in trauma and orthopaedics. 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COURSE CO-DIRECTOR

Moez Ballal (Course Co-Director)

Dr Moez Ballal is a consultant foot and ankle surgeon in SSMC, Abu Dhabi, UAE.

He completed his basic and higher surgical training in Mersey Deanery rotation with fellowship training in foot and ankle surgery in Liverpool, London and Manchester.

With over two decades of experience, Dr. Ballal has acquired robust fellowship training in foot and ankle surgery, including severe foot and ankle trauma and sports injuries. A distinguished physician, he is a member of the British Orthopaedic Association (BOA), the British Orthopaedic Foot and Ankle Society (BOFAS), and the International Society of Trauma & Orthopaedic Surgery (SICOT). Furthermore, Dr. Ballal is a member and Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh.



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Dr. Maan Taba

Dr Maan Taba earned his MD in Orthopedics and MS in Surgery from Spain and the FRCS in Trauma and Orthopedics from the UK. He gained extensive experience in his area of specialty specialization while training in the Royal National Orthopedic Hospital in Stanmore, UK.

Dr. Taba assesses his patients thoroughly, so they can be conservatively treated. He believes in minimal invasive surgery to manage the correction of all foot defects. His areas of expertise include management of sports Injuries which includes fractures and instability; ankle deformities; ankle rheumatoid disease and total ankle replacement.



Prof. Dr. Les Cannon

Dr Les Cannon is a UK trained consultant trauma and orthopaedic surgeon.

He is English and studied medicine in London, qualifying as a doctor in 1991. He underwent general surgical training before starting higher training in orthopaedic surgery.

Dr. Cannon underwent specialist foot and ankle training in the Nuffield Orthopaedic Centre, Oxford, UK. He then undertook a year in the North Sydney Orthopaedic and Sports Medicine Centre, Australia gaining experience in managing elite sportsmen and women. He was then appointed as a consultant in 2004.

Dr. Cannon spent 9 years working at the Royal Hospital Haslar and the Queen Alexandra Hospital on the south coast of England as a Trauma and Foot & Ankle surgeon.

He then moved to the UAE in 2013 and became Head of Orthopaedics at Mafraq Hospital, until 2016 when he moved to Healthpoint Hospital where he spent 5 years as a consultant and Education Lead.

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Dr. Lucky Jeyaseelan

Mr Jeyaseelan is a Consultant Trauma & Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Surgeon based at the internationally renowned Barts Health NHS Trust, which includes one of the busiest trauma units in Europe, The Royal London Hospital. He is the Clinical Lead of Elective Orthopaedic Care at the Barts Health Orthopaedic Centre and an Honorary Senior Clinical Lecturer at Queen Mary University London (QMUL). He specialises in all aspects of F&A care including complex trauma, deformity correction, minimally invasive surgery and sports injuries. He has a particular interest in ankle arthritis and total ankle replacement. He also specialises in dealing with the longer-term impact of trauma and post-traumatic reconstructions. He is the Chair of the Foot & Ankle Committee of SICOT and sits on the Evidence Based Medicine Committee of the American Orthopaedic Foot & Ankle Society (AOFAS) and the Elective Orthopaedic Committee of the British Orthopaedic Association (BOA). He is an examiner at The Royal College of Surgeons of England and also a Co-Opted Member of the Royal College of Physicians.



Dr. Julie Kohls

Miss Julie Kohls is a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon specialising in Foot and Ankle Surgery who has worked at the Royal Surrey Hospital since July 2007. Julie sees all manner of Foot and Ankle problems and is also committed to the care of diabetic patients and co-runs Diabetes MDT clinics. Julie is Canadian and she qualified in medicine at Western University in Ontario in 1996 followed by the Orthopaedic surgery training program at the University of Toronto. After arriving in London, UK in 1999, Julie completed her training in Orthopaedic surgery on the London Northwest training program. In 2007 Julie became a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England (FRCS Tr & Orth). Julie completed two years of Fellowship Training in Foot and Ankle Surgery. He was the former Clinical Director for Clyde Orthopaedic Services and led through the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic and the trauma services redesign in 2021. Before this, he held positions of Clinical Lead for Trauma and the West of Scotland Foot and Ankle Society Chair.
